Yes, you can use a 6Ah battery instead of a 4Ah battery, as long as it's within the same voltage platform (e.g., 40V Greenworks tool with a 40V 6Ah battery). A ...

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A standard 48V inverter operates within a narrow 47V-55V range. But wide-voltage models stretch this to 40V-60V, acting like adaptable polyglots for solar, battery, and hybrid systems.

Using a 60V battery on a 40V tool is not recommended. While the physical connection may fit, the higher voltage can damage the tool's internal components, leading to malfunction or failure.

I'm assuming a lawn mower is around 1kW, maybe 2kW max. For this power, the battery-inverter-motor system can be sanely designed between about 30 to 150V, I'd say, with little ...

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
